The Pageant at a Glance

Who can compete?

Any healthy cat & dog over the age of 6 months at the time of the pageant. The age limit is set so that the pet can have had his/her rabies shot and other important vaccines.

Divisions

Cat (Male & Female)

Dog (Male ℰ Female)

Titles awarded (for each division)

1st Place: King & Queen 2nd Place: Prince & Princess 3rd Place: Lord & Lady

Requirements to Participate

Recent Vet check-up certificate (rabies shot)

Signed contract & release form (these can be filled in at the time of the headshot & Interview)

\$75 donation to the Alaska Humane Society (entry fee)

Interest in raising awareness for the animal shelter community in the State of Alaska

Kennel for cat contestant / leash for dog contestant - this is for your pet's safety, and for the safety of the other pets at the Pageant.

How much does it cost to compete/watch the Pet Pageant?

To compete: Raise a minimum of \$75 to the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue.

To watch: \$5 entry fee at the door (to the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue)

Where does the money go?

100% of all money raised go to the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue

What do the winners receive?

The 1st Place winner of each division (cat & dog) and gender (boy/girl)
wins the title of either King or Queen
Sash & Crown
Portrait session with Hannah Kåhlman - Artist Photographer
Prices from sponsors
Represent the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue
at events throughout the year

FAQ continued

Cats - talent

Due to cats being shy than dogs in general, we do not require your cat to perform his/her talent on-stage during the event. You can record a good quality video (no longer than 2 minutes) to show during the pageant. (Note that your cat does need to be present during the pageant, however.)

Do they need to dress up?

No - we do not require that you dress your cat/dog up for the pageant.

We encourage some flair, but just for the cuteness factor

(it will not be scored).

Safety

Safety is our #1 priority during the pageant.

All dogs will be required to be on a leash at all times, and with a handler. (We do not want any dogs/cats/humans to be hurt - dogs and cats can easily be scared and might act aggressively to defend themselves).

Cats will need both a leash and a kennel.

Stages of Competition

There will be 5 stages of competition:

Interview

(done at the time of the headshot session).

Introduction

(speak a little bit about your pet, and time to brag about him/her)
Talent

(anything that your cat/dog does that makes people smile/laugh/go "aww" or "wow")

Cat / Dog walk

& On-stage questions

(Dog walk will be a small test of basic sit & lay skills. Cats can either walk on-stage or be carried by their handler. The on-stage question will be 2 questions for the handler: 1st is about the cat/dog.

and the 2nd is about the shelter community.

We will provide a general outline of what the latter question might be about so you can study/prepare.)



Preparing for the Pet Pageant

Paperwork, Headshot & Interview

Each contestant needs to fill out and hand in the following paperwork, and do the following before the Pageant on March 9th 2019:


- 1. Shots records or vet note (of shots being up to date). Rabies vaccination is required to compete.
 - 2. Official sign-up registration form
- 3. Release statement: Statement of dog's/cat's sociability, and a release form releasing anyone involved with the pageant (excluding the dog's/cat's owner/handlers) from responsibility from any damages caused by dog/cat.
- 4. Headshot (done at Hannah Kåhlman Artist Photographer's studio. Hand in paperwork at this time.
- 5. Interview (will be done and taped at the time of the headshot session)
- 6. Raise money for the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue (turn in donations directly to the shelter representatives at the Pageant at the time of check-in).

 Minimum of \$75 required to compete.

 Prize awarded to biggest donations collected.

 Donations above the \$75 minimum can be accomplished by selling tickets to the Pageant (\$5/ticket) or by selling CertifiCATs (\$5/ticket) for KitTea time (a monthly coffee/tea social event with snacks, held in the same location as the Pageant, to raise awareness & donations to the AKHS & CCCR.

 CertifiCATs can be collected during the Headshot & Interview, or during check-in at the Pageant).



Preparing for the Pet Pageant

1. Decide on a talent for your cat/dog, and practice.

The talent can take up to 2 minutes, and is anything that will make the audience/judges smile or be wowed.

(Cat talent can be recorded in a good quality video at home.)

- 2. Practice basic skills of sit, lay and stay (for dogs). This will be tested during the dog walk.
- 3. For cats, practice having the cat walk in a harness on a leash.

4. Bring to the pageant:
leash;
kennel (required for cat, encouraged for dog);
water & food dishes;
food for your cat/dog;
bribing snacks for on-stage competition
(we will be providing basic calm-down treats backstage);
pop-bags for walking your dog
(basic cat litter & boxes will be supplied for each cat to reduce risk of cross-contamination between cats).

5. Pamper your cat/dog. This is not a beauty-competition, but cleanliness is encouraged.

- 6. Raise donations for the Pageant (\$75 minimum) with the help of friends and family.
 - 7. Sell tickets to the Pageant (\$5/ticket) or CertifiCATs (\$5/ticket) for KitTea time.
- 8. Read up on the rescue shelter community, in particular about the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue.

HEADSHOT & INTERVIEW

HEADSHOT

Your pet's headshot session needs to be schedule directly with Hannah Kåhlman - Artist Photographer. You can contact the studio either by

The headshot session is free of charge (Paid through sponsorship by the studio).

The session itself will take about 30 minutes & you will chose your favorite portrait to use for the pageant. There will also be a portrait taken of you and your pet.

INTERVIEW

The Interview takes places immidiately after your headshot session. It is recorded on video, and will be seen by the Pageant Judges before the Pageant.

You will be asked a series of questions about both your cat/dog, and about the no-kill/rescue community in the State of Alaska and in general.

This is to both get to know you and your cat/dog better, and to score how comfortable you are talking to new people in a new atmosphere.

This is important as the title holders will be asked to participate in public events to speak about no-kill animal rescues, such as the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue.

Don't worry - you do not need to be a public speaker. Just friendly and willing to small talk with strangers.

KitTEA Time

What it is:

KitTEA time is easily put a social event where you come to the studio of Hannah Kåhlman - Artist Photographer (same place as the Pageant) to socialize with other pet-lovers, while drinking tea, coffee or sparkling water & snacking on cookies and pastries.

Held once a month, due to limited seating a purchase of a CertifiCAT is needed in advance (\$5/ticket - the donation is split between the Alaska Humane Society & Clear Creek Cat Rescue)

To raise money & awareness for the AKHS & CCCR, we encourage you to sell CertifiCATS in advance to friends and family, and you can pick up the physical tickets at the time of the pageant.

The most money raised receives a prize from the sponsors at the Anchorage Pet Pageant.





1 PM: (Dog) Contestants arrive. (

Cat contestants arrive at no later than 3:30, to ensure less stress on the cats.

You are welcome to come at 1 PM, but are not required to. The cats are seperated from the dogs in a seperate room with a lockable door.)

All paperwork due at this point. All donations to the shelters are due (give them to the shelter representatives).

1:15 PM: (Dog) Dress-rehearsal starts. General run-down/walk-through of the pageant itself.

2:30 PM: Doors open. Audience comes and mingles.

3 PM: Pageant starts! Keynote speaker invites everyone to enjoy the event, and gives information about the AKHS & CCCR.

3:5 PM: On-stage introduction of all contestants one-by-one (Dog division). All dogs and handlers on stage, or one at a time (this will be decided during dress-rehearsal).

30 seconds per dog.

3:20 PM: Talent. (Dog divison). Up to 2 minutes per dog allowed.

4:00PM: Intermission for dogs. Walk, play, feed ℰ water.

4:00 PM: Introduction. (Cat division). All cats and handlers on stage. 30 seconds per cat.

4:05 PM: Talent. (Cat division). Up to 2 minutes per cat alowed. Can be recoding from home, or done live on stage (depending on how comfortable the cat is and talent itself).

4:15 PM: Intermission for cats. Walk, play, feed ℰ water.

4:15 PM: Dog walk on stage. Basic skills of sit and lay down tested. At the end of the walk, the handler will be asked 2 on-stage questions: one about the pet, and one about the shelter community (to show knowledge and interest in raising awareness).

4:45 PM: Cat walk on stage. Cat can either walk, or be carried by handler. At the end of the walk, the handler will be asked 2 on-stage questions: one about the pet, and one about the shelter community (to show knowledge and interest in raising awareness).


4:55 PM: Intermission. Judges finish scoring. Photobooth open. Tea & Coffe and snacks sold for donations.

5:15 PM: Crowning. (Cat division). All contestants on stage
– all must remain for Official Crowning Portraits.
After crowning & portraits, all cat contestants are excused.

5:30 PM: Crowning (Dog division). All contestants on stage
– all must remain for Official Crowning Portraits.

After crowning & portraits, all dog contestants are excused.

6 PM: Pageant end.
